- 1. Call to order/Welcome: Claudia L. called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm.
- 2. President's Report:

EPS Referendum-

Please remember to "Vote YES for EPS!" on election day Tuesday November 8th. If you are a registered voter please visit your polling place either: Lakeside Church -3939 Howard Street or Emily Oaks 4650 Brummel Street and look for the ballot question at the very end. It will read:

"Shall the Board of Education of East Prairie School District Number 73, Cook County, Illinois, build and equip a school building to replace the East Prairie School Building, improve the site thereof and issue bonds of said School District to the amount of \$47,353,147.00 for the purpose of paying the costs thereof?"

4. Secretary's Report:

- A. Didn't have printed copies of October's minutes, so we will wait until next month to approve the minutes.
- 5. School Report-Erin Stein gave the school report.
 - A. There is no teacher parking at Lakeside Church on Election day, November 8th, so teachers will be parking on the streets that day.
 - B. Update on the lunchroom situation. At October's meeting, a few parents expressed concern that their children were not having enough time to eat lunch and being told they weren't allowed to talk during lunch. Ms. Stein talked to the teachers about getting kids to spend time eating rather than socializing. This will also be reviewed at the upcoming team leader meeting. Ms. Stein also met with the teachers' aides who supervise getting students into the lunchroom. They reported that they spend a lot of time getting children to be quiet and this causes significant delays on getting students into the lunchroom and seated. They reported that historically, they have asked the children to be perfectly silent. Ms. Stein explained to the teachers' aides that as long as the children are not disrupting the learning environment, they do

not have to be 100% silent before proceeding into the lunchroom. Ms. Stein advised them that as long as the children are using level 1 voices, that is fine. Hopefully, this will minimize delays and give the children more time to eat.

- c. Also, there have been some reports of children coming home with garbage in their lunch and reporting that they are not allowed to throw their garbage away. Ms. Stein clarified that children are always allowed to throw their garbage away, but there may be specific situations where it does not happen. If this is happening routinely, however, Ms. Stein would like to know about it.
- D. Finally, Ms. Stein has instituted a no-trading toys policy (e.g. pokemon, shopkins, etc). Children need to leave these toys at home.
