1. Call to order/Welcome: Abby T. called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

2. President's Report:

6. Other Business:

At our previous meeting, a representative from the EPS Community Initiative came to discuss and answer questions regarding the upcoming referendum. Tonight we will vote to determine if the PTA will fully support this referendum.

Claudia made a motion: I, Claudia Lopez, make a motion to support the EPS referendum to build a new school. Abby T. seconded the motion. Open the floor for discussion.

Angel suggested that board member, Mary, synopsize the Vision73 effort on how the decision was made to build a new school. Mary summarized the effort as follows: the building is more than 60 years old and it probably had a lifetime of 40-50 years. In order to maintain the building for approximately 10 years (fix cracks in foundation, etc), it would cost about \$17 million. To build a new building will cost up to \$47 million for a building with 75 year life span.

Dr. Madl expanded on the details and encouraged everyone to check out the video tours at the Vision 73 website.

Mary mentioned that there is a calculator on the Vision73 website to calculate how much your tax increase will be. It will be phased building that will take about 2 summers and 1 school year.

Please attend the town hall on October 13th at 7pm, if you'd like more information. There will also be tours of the school at 6:30pm.

Sarah Connolly asked what is meant by 21st century learning. Dr. Madl addressed the question by saying that teaching is changing and rather than rote memorization, students are expected to learn much larger amounts of material. They are being taught to be critical thinkers. Ms. Stein also mentioned that modern classrooms are not built with a "front" of the classroom but rather are more flexible to allow for collaborative learning.
